

## Contra Costa County reviews Agricultural Land Use Policy



Goal: Sustaining Agricultural lands by Improving Economic Vitality

Contra Costa County Supervisor Diane Burgess invites Contra Costa County farmers and other stakeholders to a series of meetings with county planners and supervisors. Together, attendees will envision potential changes to land use ordinances that would encourage agritourism development and other agricultural-support uses that maintain economic sustatainability for farms and ranches..

Farmers, ranchers and agricultural organizations at the first public meeting, held on June 21, began proposing county agricultural policies that allow farm stays, rural restaurants, incubator farms for new farmers, clean safe farm-worker housing, and cattle

grazing on public parkland, as a start.

The second in the series of six meetings will be held Thursday, July 19, 2018 from 6 pm - 8 pm at the Contra Costa County Department of Conservation and Development, Zoning Administrator Room <u>30 Muir Rd, Martinez CA.</u> The ambitious goal of this review process is to present initial recommendations

to the county Board of Supervisors in December 2018, to prepare a new draft ordinance in Winter 2019, hold public review of the draft ordinance in Spring 2019, and bring the draft ordinance up for consideration by the Board of Supervisors by Summer 2019.
