

County Agritourism Regulatory Updates

Agritourism land use COMMENTS DUE in Contra Costa County

Goal: Sustaining Agricultural lands by Improving Economic Vitality



Discussion wraps up in Contra Costa County after a series of meetings to review the County's land use policies related to agriculture.

The Agricultural Land Use Process Review is an engagement process for interested stakeholders to review agricultural sustainability and economic vitality in Contra Costa County by reviewing existing land use regulations and providing input on potential modifications to these policies.

Comments on the draft recommendations on reforming agricultural land use are due by Thursday October 31, 2019.

Microenterprise Home Kitchen Operation (MHKO) is a food facility that is operated by a resident in a private home where food is stored, handled, and prepared for, and may be served to consumers either directly or through delivery. Food must be prepared, cooked, and served on the same day with a maximum of 30 meals per day, or a total of 60 meals per week. Funding Opportunities:

Farmer/Rancher SARE Grants

The Sustainable Agriculture Research & Education (SARE) Farmer/Rancher grant program involves agricultural producers as the main applicants, and technical advisor(s) to implement projects to address identified needs in sustainable agriculture. Producers integrate research and education to conduct on-site/on-farm experiments to improve production, marketing, and the environment. Projects are limited to \$20,000 for one producer or to \$25,000 for three or more producers, for up to three years. Applications due November 11.

The California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) conducts an annual competitive solicitation process to award Specialty Crop Block Grant Program (SCBGP) funds to projects that enhance the competitiveness of California specialty crops. Specialty crops are fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, and horticulture and nursery crops (including floriculture).
